


SYNOPSIS

Summer and Autumn are in love, but there's a problem in their love nest. Autumn roams the house, spanner in hand, looking for a drip she can't see while Summer plans a spectacular skating party. With cracks emerging in their relationship, tough questions need to be asked. What if Julia Gillard doesn't like the ornamental ice vulture, or Penny Wong can't skate? And why is ice starting to appear on the floor of their St Kilda living room?

A modern fairytale that begins with salsa, pirouettes into the clouds and ends on a snow-capped mountain, **Skating in the Clouds** is an adventurous new work by playwright Clare Mendes. The recipient of a Malcolm Robertson Foundation grant, and featuring a creative team led by artists from Melbourne Writers' Theatre, this magic-realist romp draws audiences into the intricate relationship of Summer and Autumn – with its romance and arguments, dancing and dreaming – then takes you on their ride.

Powered by an all-female cast and crew, Skating in the Clouds pays special tribute to the unique strength and style of 50+ women. Finally, girls, a play written for Us!





CLARE MENDES PLAYWRIGHT / PRODUCER

Clare wrote advertisements, radio plays, novels and Neighbours scripts before becoming a playwright. Skating in the Clouds is her fourth play, and the first in a series of epic, magic-realist, adventurous works to be created by an all-female cast and crew. Clare developed Skating in the Clouds with a grant from the Malcolm Robertson Foundation. The Company Manager of Melbourne Writers' Theatre, she also produces MWT's theatrical seasons. Away from the luxury of theatre Clare volunteers with the Alliance for International Women's Rights, empowering Afghan women through education. Clare loves poetry, boxing, birds, and nudging her audiences towards new thinking.



ELLIE NIELSEN ASSISTANT DIRECTOR

Ellie is an author, actor and dramaturg. Her first book, Buying a Piece of Paris, was published by Scribe in Australia, Atlantic Publications in the UK and St Martins Press in the USA and Canada. Ellie's dramaturgy includes seven years at Playbox Theatre, Melbourne and five years assessing new Australian musicals for production house, Magnormous. She has contributed to the judging panels of OzMade Musicals and the Wal Cherry play awards. Ellie was last seen on stage in All Those Sunsets by Peter Rose at fortyfivedownstairs. She is a graduate of the Victorian College of the Arts Drama School and holds a Masters Degree in Creative Writing from RMIT.

SHARYN BRAND SOUND DESIGNER

Sharyn Brand is a sound based installation artist and collaborator whose practice draws from urban ethnography and research. She navigates and interprets the complexity of the world through an investigation of both sounds and silence. Her installations offer deep listening and uncover the hidden and forgotten through the nuance of spaces in between.

Sharyn's most recent works are but not limited to headphones pieces; Soundscape for Public art circus performance Momentum Arts Centre Melbourne for Alter State Festival (2022), and experimental & binaural Ephemeral Simultaneous Doubt at La Mama (2022). Sound design and composition; Conservatory (performed inside a conservatory 2022/3), Momentum at Bowery Theatre (2023) and Birth and Death of a Physical Performer at Arts House (2023).

She was also selected to participate in the Melbourne Writers Theatre's development program Page to Stage 2023 where she developed the script 'Immodest Acts' read at Theatreworks in November. Barbara was Stage Manager on the MWT's production of The Critical Marriage at Gasworks in 2023 and Jennie! at Gasworks in 2024.



LUCY PAYNE MOVEMENT COORDINATOR

Lucy Payne (she/her) is a Naarm-based, queer, multidisciplinary creative focusing on urgent, politically engaged theatre that always has storytelling at its core. As an Intimacy Director she has trained with US-based Intimacy Directors & Coordinators International (IDC) whilst building her practical portfolio in Naarm. Lucy's previous acting credits include Unestablished (La Mama), Mi:Wi 3027 (La Mama), Exiles (FortyFiveDownstairs), An Indigenous Trilogy (La Mama), Bayou Bart (Theatreworks) and Hey is Dee Dee Home? A Punk Rock Sitcom (The Knack Theatre). As a creative her credits include My First Bike (La Mama), Me & the DOG (Melbourne Fringe), ADA (La Mama) and Pieces of Shit (Butterfly Club) among others. Lucy was part of the 2023 La Mama Pathways course for emerging playwrights.



REBECCA MORTON PERFORMER

Rebecca Morton originally trained in Music Theatre at the WAAPA. She believes in the power of stories and songs to enlighten, uplift and transform the world. She has worked nationally and internationally in opera and theatre, musical theatre, circus, Shakespeare, and 60s rock and roll. Most recently as an actor she has participated in the development of several new Australian works, runs two singing groups and takes clients in her therapeutic Breathwork practice in Castlemaine, and is currently offering a workshop as a practical resource for the enhanced wellbeing of the creative industry.
